I am encouraged to visit the Careers Hub regularly to file my letters, awards, and school value awards which builds my skills and confidence and helps me recognise my own strengths as well as encouraging me to have a positive attitude.

During an enrichment day I learn about the skills needed in Suffolk and beyond and why Labour Market Information can help students make informed choices. (2)

I have engaged with a variety of employers during a speed networking event during enrichment day to learn about different professions. (5)

I have watched Careers TV interviews during subject lessons and learnt what personality traits are needed for that job and routes into that profession. (2)(4)

I have learnt about financial risk and tax and how this relates to my gross income in the future depending on my tax bracket.

I will attend a Careers Fair where I can meet local employers and further and higher education providers. (5)(7) I learn about gender stereotyping and equal opportunities in the workplace. (3)

I learn about interview skills and professional communication.

I will be encouraged by my tutor to complete my half ribbons and receive a badge for each. (3)

I will use the School's Careers platform Morrisby to help guide me in which subjects I should take for GCSEs. (3)

I will attend a Careers Fair where I can meet local employers and further and higher education providers. (5)(7)

I start working on creating a CV during an ICT lesson ready for my Mock Interview next year. I complete my CV during Enrichment along with a cover letter in preparation for mock interviews.

The full ribbon framework will be explained to me and I will be encourage to take part in order to complete them by the end of Year 11.

I learn about equality and descrimination during an enrichment day. (3)

I learn how to prepare for an interview and how to make an impression on a future employer.

I have a mock interview with a local employer and gained feedback from them on my performance. (5)

I will have one week of work experience in a job that I have requested or something close to it, face to face or online. (6)

I am encouraged to start considering where I want to go after completing my GCSEs in Year 11 and can attend an in school Further Education fair where I can find out more about local Colleges, Sixth Forms and Apprenticeships.

If I am a high achieving student I may choose to take part in a specialised Oxbridge programme. (3)

I will have a 1:1 Careers guidance meeting with a qualified careers adviser to discuss my post 16 options. (8) I learn about Labour Market information and how to use it when deciding on a future profession. (2)

I can attend a Further Education Fair to understand what my options are including Apprenticeships. (7)

I can arrange a 1:1 Careers Guidance Meeting with the Careers Manager to discuss my options and help me make a decision about what to do next. (8)

I will be awarded my full ribbons with my record of achievement folder during graduation by the Headteacher. (3)

I have access to Morrisby which suggests jobs and subjects I might want to consider based on my interestd and qualifications. (3)

I will attend a Careers Fair where I can meet local employers and further and higher education providers.
