Below is Poppy Curran's (Year 12) feedback on the "Aspiring Doctors" course she has been taking part in for the last 2 months.

"Since October, I've been lucky enough to get a place on the Medic Mentor Medical work experience. It's an amazing program which dives into every aspect of medicine as much as possible across the 6 months, touching on the 4 pillars of medical ethics and the values of the NHS, all information that is vital to an application to medical school. But it's not just the information they give you; so far, they've taken me (along with thousands of others) through real life medical scenarios, with one session focusing on respiratory issues and resulting in us watching a demonstration of an intubation and then ICU care and the second session surrounding pregnancy.

It's a wildly diverse program that highlights the importance of every aspect of the clinical team and excellent for providing an insight into medicine as they look at different sectors. I would highly recommend getting involved as it's great at providing a realistic point of view into the medical world and it's fun to watch!"
